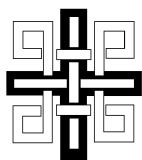

Sacred Story – Week 35

Choose the time and place for your 15-minute prayer time.

- ♦ We continue our lessons on Spiritual Discernment. We take “reading time.”
- ♦ We commit to develop a rhythm of daily prayer that will carry us for the rest of our life.
- ♦ Spend no more/no less than 15 minutes for Sacred Story prayer on the meditation concepts one through five.

Week 35

- ♦ Week 35 presents us with St. Ignatius’ three principal sources of spiritual desolation, which further clarify the spiritual nature of life that we are beginning to discover.
- ♦ This lesson also clarifies the importance of our simple journal exercise at the end of the day to help us “see” what happened in the day, bringing issues into clear relief. “Now is the time to wake from sleep” we hear St. Paul reminding us (Rom 13: 11).
- ♦ The three causes of desolation help us learn from difficult topics in our history. With clarity, we learn to slowly make changes that will improve our peace of mind and heart.
- ♦ We are learning ways to work on our life problems that help us reject influence that make us lose hope and accept influence that invite solutions that have mercy and patience.
- ♦ Jesus will help us find great freedom which includes deeper faith, hope and love.
